COMMENTS: ■Phillips – yesterday I had the opportunity to speak at the grand opening of Quick Quack Car Wash, the Mayor was unable to attend because of issues relative to flooding. The Company made a donation of \$4,000 to the Brindley family, they have had some medical issues. They came in a wanted to help and they want to become part of the community. Second item, I know crews are stretched, but along Sage Dr. and by the Tagg N Go on College Way, we have major weeds growing. Finally, I want to make sure we are moving ahead to address some of the flooding concerns, so we are better prepared if another round comes. ■Mayor – I am hoping by next week we will have a formatted presentation on the post-flood scenario. We filled/delivered over 19,000 sand bags, we have had 3 street sweepers all day the past week starting between 4:00 to 5:00 a.m. before traffic is on the road, our treatment plant had off the chart muddy water on both Monday and Sunday 26th and 1st and it took 12 hours to get the flows back to normal. One employee got shocked by lightning and lived. The crews have cleaned 70 inlet grates in the past week after Monday's flooding left debris. A lot of detention basins are filled with silt, they are cleaning those. We still have road damage; Cody Drive is still closed. Rainbow Canyon and Three Fountains we are still assessing roads and sidewalks, it has been a very ongoing process with the
